



## **DRESS CODE/WHAT TO WEAR**

### **COMMITTEE, BOARD MEETINGS, AND GENERAL SESSIONS**

Business casual attire is recommended, such as open collar shirts and slacks for gentlemen, and skirts, slacks and/or dresses for ladies.

### **WELCOME RECEPTION**

Resort casual attire is recommended, such as open collar shirts and slacks for gentlemen, and skirts, slacks and/or summer dresses for ladies.

### **GALA DINNER & RECEPTION ATTIRE**

This year we are going to be toning down the dress code for the Gala Dinner & Reception to better suit our environment, as such we suggest gentlemen to dress in what is best described as Keys Casual – collared shirts and dress trousers and equally appropriate attire for ladies.

### **GOLF**

Golf Courses and Practice Range require collared shirts for men (no mock turtle necks) and appropriate golfing shorts (no cargo shorts). Sleeveless golf blouses with collars are permissible for ladies, as is other appropriate golfing attire. Golf shoes must have non-metal spikes and shirt tails must be tucked in at all times.

### **FISHING**

The following is recommended to participants in the TAUC and Union Sportsmen's Alliance (USA) Sports Fishing Tournament: sunscreen, polarized sunglasses, hats and preferably non-skid shoes with non-marking soles.

### **DINING ATTIRE**

The required attire for gentlemen in all restaurants is collared shirts and dress trousers and equally appropriate attire for ladies. If worn, shorts must be of walking length. Please note that smart long denim (jeans) is only allowed in Gianni, Islander, Reef Lounge, Burgee Bar, Raw Bar, and during breakfast service in The Ocean Room.

## HEADWEAR

Gentlemen are expected to remove their hats whenever entering a Club facility, excluding the Raw Bar, where headwear is acceptable.

## RECREATION ATTIRE

Cut-off, unhemmed and tattered jean shorts are not allowed. Each recreational area also has dress requirements, as shown below:

## TENNIS & CROQUET

Tennis requires appropriate tennis clothing and footwear and all-white attire must be worn on the Croquet Courts. Swim trunks and cotton t-shirts are not permitted.

## BATHING ATTIRE

Bathing cover-ups, as well as footwear, must be worn in all areas away from the beach and pools on Buccaneer Island. Thong-style bathing suits are not allowed.

## FITNESS CENTER & OUTDOOR EXERCISE

Shirts must be worn for jogging, walking and other forms of exercise within the community. Tank tops and cutoff shirts are not permitted on Men. Ladies' shirts must have full coverage.

## NAME TAGS

Name tags are not to be worn outside the designated meeting area. They should be removed when traveling about the Club and when in common areas.

Ocean Reef is a Private Members Only Club. Although it has many amenities and activities available it is different from a Resort in many ways. One of the most visible being the required Dress Code. With respect to their traditions and culture we ask that you please keep the following in mind as you pack and prepare for your time at the Club.

## CELLULAR TELEPHONES

Use of cell phones in any of the Club's restaurants is not permitted.

## UNACCEPTABLE ATTIRE

Tank tops, tank-style undershirts and jogging tops for men, crop and jogging tops for women, frayed cut-offs and tattered jeans are not acceptable attire. Shirts with sleeves are required at all times in all public areas other than the pool.
